THE PURPOSE OF THE SUBJECT, LEARNING OUTCOMES:

The aim of the course is to develop an artistic / creative attitude and drawing-painting skills of appropriate quality in the BA training, and to founded this theoretically within the frame of the lessons. Through tasks, we focus in development on observation, self-expression, increasing the expressiveness of expression, finding creative solutions, and developing representation in general. The lesson develops all the creative and visual competencies that are usually required for visual representation. Visual cognition (perception, memory, interpretation) / visual learning skills, problem solving ability, visual creator, expressive ability, visual communication ability. The aim of the course is to develop a balanced and confident creative attitude in drawing and in the visual working.

SUMMARY OF THE CONTENT OF THE SUBJECT

Making art as a medium of expression

requires certain fundamentals from which one can progress. The students learn to distinguish one appearances

from another, in size or proportion, in color, and in texture. They will have the opportunity to getting familiar with

different depicting techniques and materials as well.

Using different techniques and materials on high level broaden the depicting skills and ability. Having the technique

of depicting the construction and contours of an object set in space, plus the knowledge of how light operates on

the forms, all of these skills give high level opportunity for limitless depictions.
